Student Persistence

- to develop a clear process for intake, assessment, advisement and counseling
- to help you set realistic short-term and long-term goals
- to base my lessons on meaningful, relevant content, so as to keep you engaged
- to allow you to feel immediate success, by providing regular recognition of progress
- to identify how you learn (cognition) by using multiple instructional approaches
- to assist you in identifying any learning disabilities you may have
- to refer you to other services or agencies in-house and external, when appropriate.
- to organize the learning environment to enable you to participate in real life communication, negotiation, problem solving and decision making

Student Transition

- to help you be better prepared for post secondary education or the workforce by focusing Reading, Writing and Math instruction on real-life situations
- to invite volunteers from different careers to visit our classroom and discuss how they use math, reading and writing in the workplace
- to include teaching strategies to better prepare you for post secondary education or the workforce

Student Placement

- to provide information on career exploration to assist you in career planning
- to provide you with access to guidance counseling, providing adequate support, encouragement and mentoring
- to plan activities with local community colleges and employers to support your transition and placement
- to include personal skill development activities in our instruction

Student Completion

- to assist you in preparing to take the GED Tests by providing resources regarding GED cost, flexible scheduling, accessibility and accommodations
- to provide you with the skills necessary for you to be successful after you complete the GED tests
- to encourage you to take the GED Tests **when you are ready**
- to be here for you if you need to retake one or more of the GED tests
